- **Holy Communion:** As Lutheran Christians, we believe, teach and confess that the risen Lord Jesus Christ is actually present in the Sacrament of Holy Communion. He gives us His true body and blood in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of our sins. This teaching of the real presence of Christ is central to our celebration of this sacrament. Therefore, we practice fellowship or close communion—meaning we believe those approaching the altar should share this core belief. Grape juice is available in the center cup of the tray.
